1. This Seattle native glass blowing artist will have an exhibit on Seattle Center campus next year.

2. What is the structure that was a gift in 1962 during the Seattle World's Fair by its first sister city as a resonating gesture of friendship and goodwill between two nations?

3. Dip your feet into a cool, aqua blue basin, where cast bronze formations serve as splashing reminders of the 1962 Seattle World's Fair. Who created the Fountain of Creation?

4. Aqua-phobics won't want to linger too long in its inner circle for fear of its jetting musical fleur-de-lis, super shooters and powerful 130-high blasts that fire like geysers.

5. Which Rock and Roll icon, featured in previous EMP exhibitions, was an attendee at the 1962 Seattle World's Fair and played a part in a similarly named film?

6. Constructed partially from pieces from the original Seattle Center Fountain, this garden space rests serenely in the summer shadow of Seattle's icon.

7. During the Seattle World's Fair, Seattle Center Coliseum was used for concerts, ice shows, circuses, and professional wrestling events. What is this building now called?

8. Designed by famed architect, Frank Gehry, and built to completion in 2000, this structure is said to resemble a smashed electric guitar when seen from above.

9. Originally built for the 1962 Seattle World's Fair, this transportation system still runs daily and takes passengers through EMP.

10. This building standing at the center of campus was originally built as an Armory Building decades before the 1962 Seattle World's Fair.
